Target Setting and Tracking of Progress

Throughout the academic year, you and your parents will receive monthly snapshots of your progress. Reports will take on the form of Target Setting Reports as well as one Detailed Progress Report in the Lent term. We invite your parents to contact your form tutor if they have any concerns. Regular and transparent communication is vital in maintaining high standards. Priory 6 reports will provide an outline of the following data:

We will expect you to:

- Utilise the resources available in our remodelled scriptorium. The scriptorium will be supervised by our newly appointed librarian.
- Use to the full our Questia Online Library for wider reading and extension work. Usage will be monitored by Form Tutors.
- Make the most of the rich intellectual offerings available in London such as seminars, lectures or performances.
- You should expect to be studying for at least 2-3 hours each night. You will be tested regularly and there will be formal summer exams at the end of Lower VI and mocks in Upper VI.

At Priory 6, you will learn how to learn, and an important part of this is being responsible for managing your time effectively.

Attendance and Punctuality

We closely monitor attendance and punctuality. At Priory 6 we know it is a vital part of achieving potential. The school day will start at 8.40am and finish at 4.30pm apart from on Fridays when we finish at 3.40pm. Students who have a timetabled lesson 7 on a Friday will be allocated an alternative day when they can leave school at 3.40pm.

Please ensure that you leave the house on time and are in school at 8.30am ready to start the day. Two late arrivals in one week will lead to an automatic detention.

I also ask you to consider carefully whether you should or shouldn't be in school if unwell. At this stage in your education, you cannot afford to take sick days unless absolutely necessary. Please note that extended absence will require a letter requesting this addressed to the Headteacher Mrs Raffray.

At Priory 6, you may leave the school at lunchtime only but are required to sign in and out at reception. You must arrive promptly back at school in good time for afternoon registration.

At Priory 6 we are preparing you for the workplace. You are a role model for the girls in the lower years and we expect you to be in correct school uniform at all times.

Uniform

Here is a summary of Priory 6 uniform regulations:

- Uniform skirt no shorter than just above the knee.
- White blouse or shirt (long sleeved t-shirts are not permitted).

- Uniform cardigan (hooded tops are not permitted)
- Black leather low heeled shoes (not canvas).
- Suit jackets must be worn to and from school, during Mass, assembly and school events such as the Carol Service.
- Simple jewellery and light make-up are permitted.

Uniform worn incorrectly will result in warnings and if necessary, you will be sent home to change. For more details of uniform regulations, please refer to uniform information on our website.

You have a Sixth Form privilege of being permitted to "dress down" on Fridays. While we wish for you to enjoy this privilege we trust that you will wear clothing that is appropriate for the school environment (no tops exposing midriffs or very short skirts for example).

We want to promote the value of relationships and highlight the importance of using voice to communicate rather than an online persona.

Mobile Phones

You are permitted to use your mobile phone during lunchtime between 12.45pm and 1.45pm in the Common Room area, but you are not permitted to use your phone at any other time during the school day. In promoting the value of face to face relationships, we are reflecting the sentiment powerfully put across by Dr Aric Sigman in his presentations on Screen Time to girls, staff and parents earlier this year. We also observe that you benefit from an increased ability to focus on your studies without your mobile phones as a constant distraction.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

1. What happens if I want to change one of my options?

Most students are happy with their choice of A Level courses but some realise that they may have made the wrong decision. The process to change course is not one that should be taken lightly and should only be made after consultation between you, your parents, Heads of both departments, your tutor and the Director of Sixth Form. The cut off deadline for such a course change is the *beginning* of the October half-term (allowing the time for you to catch up on the new course).

2. Will I get a locker?

Your will be allocated a locker in the locker room in the Common room which you will then use for the remainder of your Lower and Upper VI years at the school. Please note that if you lose your key you will have to pay for a replacement.

3. Can I drive to school and park onsite?

It is a privilege to be able to drive to school. You must gain permission from The Bursar if you wish to use the school car park. NB While the building work is taking place, the temporary staff car park is out of bounds for Sixth Formers.

Sixth Formers are not permitted to drive other members of the school to and from school organised events unless the organising teacher has received advance written permission from the parents of both the driver and the passenger(s).

4. What shall I do if I need to speak to someone?

At Priory 6, we hope that you will have a very happy and fulfilling time. However, there may be times when you need support. All of your Form Tutors have experience in dealing with a wide range of personal and sensitive issues and will be able to offer some form of guidance. We also have a School Counsellor who is available for drop in or scheduled sessions.
